## Reading tips for at home

Whether you read a nice story before going to sleep or view a picture book together during the day; Reading makes you more fun!

During the National Reading Days there is a lot of attention for reading aloud, in the library and at school. Reading is not only a pleasant moment together, but also helps the language development and vocabulary of your child.



*In class, your child listened to the story of Coco, a young bird that does not dare to leave the nest. With these tips you can get started with the story at home.*

### Reading tip

During the reading, let your child have a say and ask questions so that your child can respond. For example:

- Coco does not dare to leave the nest, but her mother helps her. How does her mother do that?
- What would you do to help Coco?
- Have you ever done something that scared you?

*Children love it when a book is read more often. So feel free to read the book again at home!*

In the book 'Coco kan het!' A caterpillar is hiding on each page. Can you find the caterpillars?



### Play and craft tip

### Read more books?

In the library you will find many more great books besides the book about Coco.

Children up to the age of 18 can join the library for free.

Read a book together that is close to and connects to your child's experience. For example about a child who goes to school, has a little brother or sister or books about (not) daring things.

Make the reading moments a regular habit. Choose the time that suits you best: nice and quiet early in the morning, in the afternoon together on the couch or before going to sleep.
